#### VIA57 WEST

625 West 57th Street Flows Two Ways, a 60-by-60-foot aluminum, stainless-steel, and rolled-metal artwork by Stephen Glassman, sits outside this silvery tetrahedron designed by architect Biarke Ingels.





#### SKY 605 West 42nd Street

Japanese artist Yayoi Kusama's bronze pumpkin is on permanent display alongside the motor court of this 71-story tower. (Two more works by the artist lie just inside the lobby.)



## **ABINGTON HOUSE**

500 West 30th Street Sculptor Terence Main's garnet-colored concrete Urban Dogs figures greet visitors at two different entrances to this Robert A.M. Stern-designed luxury rental.



500 West 23rd Street Charlie Hewitt's 23-foothigh, 650-pound Urban Rattle anchors the second floor of this 13-story rental, on view for anyone strolling along the High Line.





# 56 LEONARD 56 Leonard Street

Anish Kapoor-who recently bought a \$13.6 million condo in this Herzog & de Meurondesigned Jenga-like skyscraper-designed the two-story-high sculpture in the entrance.



An immense gold installation by Rachel Mica Weiss and a painting by Jennifer Maravillas dominate the lobby of this Brooklyn

rental building.
