Museum fees too steep? Some cutting-edge works are on view for free—virtually right next door



SKY 605 West 42nd Street
Japanese artist Yayoi Kusama's bronze pumpkin is on permanent display alongside the motor court of this 71-story tower. (Two more works by the artist lie just inside the lobby.)

TEN23
500 West 23rd Street
Charlie Hewitt's 23-foot-high, 650-pound *Urban Rattle* anchors the second floor of this 13-story rental, on view for anyone strolling along the High Line.



56 LEONARD 56 Leonard Street
Anish Kapoor—who recently bought a \$13.6 million condo in this Herzog & de Meuron-designed Jenga-like skyscraper—designed the two-story-high sculpture in the entrance.



300 ASHLAND
300 Ashland Place
Brooklyn-based artist Adam Frank created *LUCID: 300 Ashland*, a dreamy installation that brings 3-D clouds to this tower's lobby.

VIA57 WEST
625 West 57th Street
Flows Two Ways, a 60-by-60-foot aluminum, stainless-steel, and rolled-metal artwork by Stephen Glassman, sits outside this silvery tetrahedron designed by architect Bjarke Ingels.



ABINGTON HOUSE
500 West 30th Street
Sculptor Terence Main's garnet-colored concrete *Urban Dogs* figures greet visitors at two different entrances to this Robert A.M. Stern-designed luxury rental.



UPCOMING INSTALLATIONS

Manhattan

69 East 125th Street The 12-story rental will feature 12 works by mixed-media artist Lance Johnson.

180 East 88th Street This 32-story condo (above) will include an installation by German plaster artisan Jan Hoos.

53W53 MoMA is transforming the lower two floors of architect Jean Nouvel's tower into a gallery space.

Hudson Yards Designer Thomas Heatherwick is anchoring the mega-development with a 15-story climbable sculpture.

152 Elizabeth Street Tadao Ando is creating a fog-and-light sculpture for this building, which he designed.
